A Revitalization Update

Dear FBC Friends:

One year ago I presented our Church Council, and in turn we presented the congregation, with the need for First Baptist to engage in a revitalization focus. The purpose of this focus continues to be to bring us into a better alignment to meet ministry needs and opportunities of our day. We framed this work in the language of "what gives us the best opportunity to reach those not present and keep those already engaged?"

We spent much of 2017 in a season of study, reflection and conversation about what is needed. This was followed by particular recommendations, which have become known as ministry pathways toward future priorities.

I wanted to use this space to provide you with a very brief update on what has been happening in the various pathways as work toward revitalization continues.

<u>Children & Youth:</u> One of the recommendations achieved in this pathway was the hiring of a nursery supervisor. In December we welcomed Melissa Hernandez to our staff in this Sunday morning position. Her regular presence will help little ones and their parents feel ever more comfortable in separation during worship and/or study times, and signals that we are giving priority to the needs of young families. Our FBC volunteers will continue to assist Melissa during the year.

Children's church continues to be offered during worship, and a broadly graded children's Sunday school option is offered during the 2nd hour. We have also hosted various special children's activities (Movie Night, Trunk or Treat, Breakfast with the Angels), with a winter Kidscommons Event planned for Friday, Feb. 23.

The Youth ministry has been re-organized under the leadership of two young couples as volunteer leaders, with Youth Group now meeting on Sunday mornings during the 2nd hour. This continues to be an interim step while we determine future church staffing with youth ministry.

<u>Discipleship</u>: In this newsletter you will read about our second "Grow Group" opportunity as winter groups begin to meet in late January. I hope you will consider joining one of these small groups for their five or six week duration.

Some Adult Sunday School classes continue to meet on Sunday mornings, and the discipleship/adult education team has provided an alternative Sunday 2nd hour study for those who are not part of an ongoing class.

<u>Community</u>: This pathway has three sub-groups. Community Events is working to help facilitate better connections between FBC participants. The weekly Sunday morning coffee bar has been a well-received addition. An all-church game night is planned for January 21 by this group, with much focus to date having been given to children friendly events (see above).

A Community Marketing sub-team has been at work to identify how we may improve our reach to the greater Columbus community. We are working alongside TD Advertising to gain guidance in areas such as: defining our visual identity and brand, making our website most effective, learning how to better use social media and get the FBC message out to others.

Facilities is the final sub-group of this pathway. They will be working with recommendations made by the other groups to best utilize our space to accommodate ministry priorities. We expect to see movement in this area in 2018.

<u>Missions:</u> This was originally identified as one of our strongest areas of ministry, and that continues to be the case. The Missions team is sponsoring a short-term trip to Oklahoma this coming summer, and has continued to guide us in connecting with and supporting various mission partners, including Kristy Engle – who was with us in November – Love Chapel, New Song and many more.

<u>Worship</u>: Some changes have come into our worship services as we've utilized more lay leadership in both planning and leading. The worship pathway team has done a lot of behind the scenes work to date. But, beginning in January, we will be asking you to experiment with us in a spirit of learning and trying new things. Each month (January through May) our worship services will follow a transitional trajectory, moving from a more formal and traditional service on the first Sunday of the month, to a Praise team led experience on the final Sunday of the month, with the middle services continuing a progression from one style to the other.

Why are we doing this? In our focus group work we heard very diverse hopes and preferences about worship, including an overriding preference that we maintain one primary worship experience, rather than share two services in differing styles.

I would tell you that it is very difficult to include such variety in music, approach, style in one service and do it well. It is the hope of the team that trying these differing approaches to worship for a few months will help us learn more about different styles, and how it's possible to connect, grow and serve through multiple means of worship.

After this trial period we will hold a conversation about what we are learning, and how that might impact the worship pathway as we move forward.

I realize that we may be asking some of you to step outside your preferred style of worship as we engage in this time of learning. There might be a Sunday that just doesn't connect with you – however, remember, it might really connect with someone else. I'm asking for your gracious participation in this new season of worship as we begin 2018.

The above summary has only touched on some of the highlights in the work that is ongoing among us. I continue to ask for your prayers as we move ahead. 2018 will see additional change, trying of new things, learning by trial and error, and a community of faith that loves one another and loves the Lord living together in a changing time. Remember, we seek to reach and welcome those who are not present as we minister with and to those already engaged.


FOOD FOR LOVE CHAPEL
