Dear First Baptist:



June is Men's Health Month



Why Men's Health Month?

You may ask, what's the necessity to celebrate men's health month? - Men die on an average of five years earlier than women.

The common health threats to men and their prevention here:

Cardiovascular Disease: You can keep your cardiovascular disease at bay by getting your cholesterol levels checked at the age of 25 and every five years from there on. In simple terms, you need to start checking your cholesterol levels from the time you increased your physical activities and started eating lots of fruits and vegetables.

Lung Cancer: No, there is no screening test available for detecting lung cancer at this time. Therefore, the best way to prevent lung cancer from affecting you is to quit smoking as early as possible.
