Hello FIRST BAPTIST, I have missed you!

In just a few days our summer Sabbatical journey comes to a close. I look forward to finding ways to share our experiences with one another. My first day back in the church office will be September 4, and I will be helping lead worship and returning to the pulpit on Sunday, September 9. I do hope to see you in worship that day.

What a summer it has been! Although I've been away, I have kept track of some of the things that have taken place at FBC this summer. I know, for example, that you've enjoyed some good preaching with a variety of guest pastors filling our pulpit. I've been able to watch most of the sermons online. I also know that our lay leaders have done a terrific job of keeping ministry going and providing oversight and guidance to the sabbatical summer. As I prepare to rejoin you I want to share a pastoral word in this column.

We may be the first church in the Lilly endowed program for congregational renewal to vote on a name change while the pastor was on sabbatical! Even though I was aware of this process and gave it my blessing, I have to confess it was rather odd to be out of the picture as this happened. I know the vote stirred some concern among you, and despite carrying a majority 68% in favor, failed to reach the needed 75% threshold.

So, what does this mean? It means you've behaved as good Baptists – though not because you've retained the name "First Baptist," even though that's an honorable name to uphold. No, as Baptists we have a heritage of sharing ministry through a congregational process in which each member is endowed with a voice and a vote. We believe in the priesthood of all believers and the ability of each one to discern the will of God and mind of Christ as we share ministry together. We also share a strong tradition of allowing for dissent. That is, persons who have another point of view are welcome to share it. So, even though a strong majority supported a new name, a minority of nearly 32%, for whatever reason, did not; leading us to conclude that this is not the mind of Christ at this time for First Baptist.

I am sure there is disappointment, particularly among those who worked hard to lead the church through this process and toward this decision. I am sure there is also some relief among those who feared the change and are grateful that the historic name has been preserved. But let me suggest that it's not our name that makes us Baptist – American Baptist, I might add. No, it is our adherence to certain theological principles and practices, among which is the ability to disagree without being disagreeable. I have also found truth and humor in the statement, "wherever there are three Baptists, there are at least four opinions!"

The work of congregational revitalization, and the work of ministry today, for that matter, is hard and difficult work. It requires patience, perseverance – a long obedience in the same direction. It is ultimately God's work that we are privileged to participate in through prayer and mission partnership. It's especially difficult to do this work in a congregational system like ours – but this is who we are and will continue to be – regardless of our name. As I have often said, "Being Baptist is messy!"

I hope you can see and celebrate with me that we have in fact strengthened our Baptist identity and practice through the events of this summer in many ways. Among these are the reliance on strong lay leadership – a key identifier of any Baptist congregation. We've had a strong reconnection with our American Baptist partners, as most of the summer preachers have come from the ABC family. We've seen that the church can survive while the pastor steps away for a season of renewal.

I celebrate the changes and progress we have made together over the past many months in the work of revitalization. I invite you to measure that progress in a variety of ways, and not just numerically. I'm ready to lend my voice, once again, to our common cause and I'm excited to see where another year will take us. I'm inviting you to be an active part of the life we share together. Remember, you always get more out of what you put more into. That's true in life and it's true in congregational life. So, hello FIRST BAPTIST, let's begin afresh in what the Lord has laid before us.



Healthy Living Tips

September is Cholesterol Awareness Month

Cholesterol is a waxy, fat-like substance that your body produces and is necessary for many body functions. However, when there is too much cholesterol in the bloodstream, some will build up on the walls of the blood vessels, including those of the heart. Over time, this build-up can impede the flow of blood. High blood cholesterol is a risk factor for coronary heart disease (CHD).

As the leading cause of death in the United States, CHD has the potential for touching many, many Americans. One of every two males and one of every three females aged 40 years and over will develop CHD sometime in their lives. The good news is that people CAN prevent heart disease by controlling those risk factors that can be modified. By lowering risk factors – through exercise, reducing saturated fats and cholesterol-containing foods, quitting smoking, and reducing excess weight, people can minimize their risk of ever developing CHD.

The National Cholesterol Education Program (NCEP) within NIH's National Heart Lung and Blood Institute recommends adults over 20 years old have their cholesterol levels checked at least every five years. The desirable cholesterol levels are listed below:

Total cholesterol: Less than 200 mg/dL.

Low Density Lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol ("bad" cholesterol): Less than 100 mg/dL.

High Density Lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol ("good" cholesterol): 40 mg/dL or higher.

Triglycerides: Less than 150 mg/dL.
