Dear Friends:

When I was a kid, I participated in 4-H. I can still remember beginning each 4-H club meeting with the 4-H pledge: I pledge my head to clearer thinking, my heart to greater loyalty, my hands to larger service, and my health to better living, for my club, my community, my country and my world. Head, heart, hands and health = the four "H's" of 4-H.

This November I want to introduce you to another set of four "H's" – the four H's of Stewardship: heart, health, hope and habits. Our 2019-20 stewardship emphasis, to be observed Nov. 10 – 17, is titled "The 4 H's of Stewardship". Over two Sundays we will look at how "healthy hearts" and "hopeful habits" can comprise a faithful response of discipleship from the perspective of stewardship.

Once again, this year's emphasis has two primary components for which we are being asked to make a response: a) our financial stewardship (stewardship of our treasure) and b) our annual ministry team sign-up process (stewardship of our time and talent). As the emphasis unfolds you will be invited to sign-up (online or via paper copy) for the ministry teams you wish to serve through in 2020. Even if you plan to serve on the same team(s) as last year, please sign up fresh for the next year.

You will also receive an Estimate of Giving card through a direct mailing, giving you opportunity to indicate how you will support our congregation's program of ministry in 2020. We will present these cards as an act of worship on Sunday, November 17 during our 9:30 a.m. worship service. Having an accurate estimate of giving allows the church council and congregation to set our 2020 budget.

We often hear how important heart health is to our physicality. A healthy heart is also important when it comes to stewardship. Jesus said, "where your treasure is, there will your heart be also". When we treasure the things of God, our hearts beat with the health of God.

Stewardship is also built on habits – hopeful habits – that enable us to build trust and live by faith in God as our provider. The psalmist says, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it". (Ps 24:1). If all that I have is a gift from God, how I care for (steward) those gifts is a response of discipleship that acknowledges and trusts in God's provision.


Please keep this emphasis in prayer. I look forward to sharing it with you.

We will be sharing in observation of All Saints Sunday on November 3. This is an annual opportunity to remember those members and loved ones who have passed on in the past year.





Healthy Living Tips

Learn About Mental Health

What is mental illness?

Mental illnesses are conditions that affect a person's thinking, feeling, mood or behavior, such as depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, or schizophrenia. Such conditions may be occasional or long-lasting (chronic) and affect someone's ability to relate to others and function each day.

What is mental health?

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel, and act. It also helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others, and make healthy choices. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood.

Although the terms are often used interchangeably, poor mental health and mental illness are not the same things. A person can experience poor mental health and not be diagnosed with a mental illness. Likewise, a person diagnosed with a mental illness can experience periods of physical, mental, and social well-being.

Why is mental health important for overall health?

Mental and physical health are equally important components of overall health. Mental illness, especially depression, increases the risk for many types of physical health problems, particularly long-lasting conditions like stroke, type 2 diabetes, and heart disease. Similarly, the presence of chronic conditions can increase the risk for mental illness.

Can your mental health change over time?

Yes, it's important to remember that a person's mental health can change over time, depending on many factors. When the demands placed on a person exceed their resources and coping abilities, their mental health could be impacted. For example, if someone caring for an ill relative or experiencing economic hardship they may experience poor mental health.

How common are mental illnesses?

Mental illnesses are among the most common health conditions in the United States.

- More than 50% will be diagnosed with a mental illness or disorder at some point in their lifetime.
- 1 in 5 Americans will experience a mental illness in a given year.
- 1 in 5 children, either currently or at some point during their life, have had a seriously debilitating mental illness.
- 1 in 25 Americans lives with a serious mental illness, such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, or major depression.

What causes mental illness?

There is no single cause for mental illness. A number of factors can contribute to risk for mental illness, such as:

- Early adverse life experiences, such as trauma or a history of abuse (for example, child abuse, sexual assault, witnessing violence, etc.)
- Experiences related to other ongoing (chronic) medical conditions such as cancer or diabetes.
- Biological factors, such as genes or chemical imbalances in the brain
- Use of alcohol or recreational drugs
- Having few friends
- Having feelings of loneliness or isolation


People can experience different types of mental illnesses or disorders, and they can often occur at the same time. Mental illnesses can occur over a short period of time or be episodic. This means that the mental illness comes and goes with discrete beginnings and ends. Mental illness can also be ongoing or long-lasting.

The deadline for filling the boxes and bringing them back is Sunday, November 17. Abigail Circle will be checking the boxes on Tuesday, November 19. Dedication and delivery will be November 24.
