UPDATE/ REQUEST FOR HELP WITH MIKE AND HEIDI PUTTERILL

Cliff and I have been so blessed by everyone's prayers, thoughts and support during this time of Heidi's health issues. We have been dealing with this now for over 9 months now and have felt your prayers throughout. It may not have seemed much, but to us it has been huge and has helped us be able to provide the support that Heidi and Mike have needed. We are now asking for your help in another way.

The last few weeks have been especially challenging as Mike and Heidi have learnt that her kidneys will not recover, and she will therefore need to remain on dialysis. This was devastating news to us all, as initially without functioning kidneys there would be no bone marrow transplant. Heidi is now very tired, anxious and despondent and has pretty much lost hope of a recovery at this stage.

However, on Tuesday this week, they met with her oncologist. He told them that he has now seen 7 more successful cases (to make a total of 8 cases), of a combined bone marrow and kidney transplant, with a 50% donor match. Heidi's sister, Erika, is a 50% match. The doctor now thinks that Heidi could be a candidate for this procedure. As a result, Heidi will have a bone marrow biopsy on Wed., Oct. 9, and can expect to get the results Friday, Oct. 18. Decisions will then need to be made as to whether to proceed or not. It is important to know that Heidi's birthday is also October 18.

Our request is this... In addition to your continued prayers, we are asking for as many people as possible to send a note, card or letter of encouragement to Heidi AND Mike (as he is also needing encouragement) in the next few days to help get them through this time of waiting. Ideally it would be great if we could almost overwhelm them with uplifting, positive messages of support so that they can physically see just how many folks are actively thinking of and praying for them. We are hoping that this might provide some comfort through this very difficult time. A birthday card to Heidi would be fantastic as well!
