
During the Advent and Christmas seasons this year I want to lead you in revisiting a Biblical word of proclamation. The word is "Behold". We will be using that word as the title of our worship/sermon series for the season.

When I read or hear the word "behold" I anticipate hearing or seeing something to follow that is significant and will make an impact on life. The word literally means "see, observe, look or gaze". A modern translation might be "look and learn" or "pay attention to this". According to one source the word appears some 1527 times in the Bible. It would seem God is always trying to get our attention!

It is fitting that we use this word during Advent, as we consider afresh the announcement of Jesus coming into the world at his birth, and we anticipate his return. These are truly events to behold. Maybe we are especially ready in this tumultuous year to reflect on the meaning of these announcements and promises. To that end I invite you to prepare for worship during the coming weeks as we follow these plans:

A Time to Wait

Advent is the first season of the Christian Year. It's the season during which the Church gathers expectantly, looking for the promised Messiah. Each of the four Sundays before Christmas emphasizes a different biblical theme: *Hope, Faith*, Joy, and Peace. These are symbolized by the candles lit each week and are highlighted by the Scripture passages read. The fifth candle is the Christ Candle, and it is lit on Christmas Day. Light is a major symbol during Advent because, as the light gets brighter and brighter each week, we know that the Light of the World is nearer. This year, as we look towards Christ's second coming, let's look back to His birth so we can look with hope to the future.

BEHOLD

It's sobering to think about the patterns of this year and how we're still waiting out this plague.

Once again, I've used "plague" very intentionally here. As you know, I've written about the Israelite's exile quite a bit this year, and we've sang, read, and prayed that imagery as a way of seeing ourselves as the living extension of the Word of God. We see patterns of exile and deliverance all over the Bible, so to hide from it, or to deny it, or to ignore it now does a disservice to what could be a beautiful story playing out before us. Sure, "beautiful" might be an insensitive way to put it, but I mean this in the most hopeful way. As Advent arrives, you can expect that, each time we gather, we will be discussing a new part of what it means to embody this season, but to start, I want to include here that the word "advent" means arrival, and wrapped up in this term is the entire biblical narrative - specifically the promise of the coming Christ - the depths of which offers consolation beyond words. This is why we don't want to just talk about Advent, but rather practice it. So, this year, as you may or may not see friends and family during the holidays and as our programming is once again altered to accommodate new Covid restrictions, I want to offer ways through which we can practice hope, faith, joy, and peace as a method of beholding the coming King. I will be offering daily readings, songs, stories, and devotionals as a way to help you practice waiting from your own homes. These will be posted on Facebook and on our website each day, and I look forward to waiting with you through them. Peace.

Healthy Living Tips

How to Select, Wear, and Clean Your Mask

CDC recommends that people wear masks in public settings, like on public and mass transportation, at events and gatherings, and anywhere they will be around other people.

Overview

- Wear masks with two or more layers to stop the spread of COVID-19
- Wear the mask over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Masks should be worn by people two years and older
- Masks should NOT be worn by children younger than two, people who have trouble breathing, or people who cannot remove the mask without assistance
- Do NOT wear masks intended for healthcare workers, for example, N95 respirators
- CDC does not recommend the use of face shields alone. Evaluation of face shields is ongoing, but effectiveness is unknown at this time.
- Evaluation of mask and gaiter materials and structure is ongoing.

How to Select

When selecting a mask, there are many choices. Here are some do's and don'ts.



Healthy Living Tips

How to Wear

Wear a mask correctly and consistently for the best protection.

- · Be sure to wash your hands before putting on a mask
- · Do NOT touch the mask when wearing it

Do wear a mask that

- · Covers your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Fits snugly against the sides of your face

How to take off a mask



How to Clean

Masks should be washed regularly. Always remove masks correctly and wash your hands after handling or touching a used mask.

- Include your mask with your regular laundry
- Use regular laundry detergent and the warmest appropriate water setting for the cloth used to make the mask
- Use the highest heat setting and leave in the dryer until completely dry
