As people come and go during the summer Sundays, our ministry at FBC continues. In August we will share a series of worship messages and experiences focused around the New Testament book Hebrews. Men of Faith will also be engaged in a study of this book on Friday mornings (beginning Aug 13). We will be asking the question: "Who is Jesus?" as we read and study Hebrews together. This book offers a comprehensive answer to that question, in a way that ties it back to the Hebrew scriptures of the Old Testament. I encourage you to read through Hebrews more than once as we work our way through the book together this month.

SEASON OF THE CHURCH: NOT THE CHURCH: MAY 23RD - NOVEMBER 21ST

"Who is Jesus?"

I'm honored to deliver the first message of our new series "Who is Jesus?" on August 1st. But, rather than turning the page to a completely new topic, we will be digging our heels into the Old Testament more by hearing about who Jesus is for us, in the roles that are outlined by the writer of Hebrews, to help us practice what we learned from our "A Unified Story" series.

I appreciate the Bible Project's explicit connection to this principle when, in their <u>overview video of Hebrews</u>, they identify that the author of Hebrews knows their audience to be a people with a "thorough knowledge of the Old Testament." This means then, that as **we** step into this New Testament sermon, we need to keep the last 8 weeks in mind so as not to forget the significant imagery and themes that we highlighted from the Old Testament. But don't worry, we'll recap these each week to jog our memories. Which brings me to my final point for this introduction: memory.

From a practical standpoint, "memory" continues to be one of the most formative aspects of faith for me. As we've now read Psalms 113-134 over the first half of the year, we're going to stay in the Psalms to keep the imagery of Israel's prayer life present in our minds and on our lips. But this time, we'll be emphasizing what are known as the "Messianic Psalms" - the Psalms which prophecy and remember who Israel's Prophet, Priest, and King really is: This is Christ for you. SEASON OF THE CHURCH: NOT THE CHURCH: MAY 23RD - NOVEMBER 21ST

The Season of Pentecost (also called "Ordinary Time" after the way the weeks are counted - first, second, third, etc.) is the final season of the Christian Calendar. This is the time when Christians embrace the life of the Church and trust the Holy Spirit to identify the Kingdom of God through the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ. This season runs from the birth of the Church at Pentecost to the newest celebration of the Christian Year: *Christ the King Sunday*.

Ordinary Time is initiated and commissioned at Pentecost by unleashing the Church on the world, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to bring the Good News of Jesus to every corner of the earth. It is therefore a season of healing, charity, service, and remembrance in the Way of Jesus as the People of Jesus. For this reason, Ordinary Time shares it's colors with Epiphany: green and white - because just as Christ entered a time of ministry and service after His birth, so too does the Church.

White Cross Gifts of the Heart

Through White Cross, these special recovery kits provide both tangible assistance to people in need and show that neighbors near and far truly care. These are sent to Church World Service, which sees that they are sent to those in need.

SCHOOL KIT

- " One pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip only) removed from package
- " Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf/filler paper)
- " One 30-centimeter 12" ruler
- " One hand-held pencil sharpener removed from package
- " One large eraser (no pencil cap erasers)
- " Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers—removed from package
- " One box of 24 crayons (only 24)

" One 12"x14" to 14"x17" finished size cotton or lightweight canvas bag (solid colored fabric) with cloth handles. No logos and no reusable shopping bags or backpacks.

Pack all items inside the cloth bag. Please place kits in the box near the kitchen. **Deadline to return School Kits is Sunday, Sept. 12.** Please donate \$2 to process and ship each kit to its final destination. It can be cash or check (made out to First Baptist Church).

Optional: Loose school items may be placed in a large Ziploc type bag to keep them together, then placed in the large bag.
