Starting a new school year is exciting...but for children who don't have school supplies, it can also be terrifying. That's where these kits, and your compassion, come in! Plus, the fabric bag you pack each kit in is a great keepsake that kids can carry all year long. Please remember to send \$2/kit to CWS to cover the costs of processing. Deadline: August 28

Supplies Needed:

- One pair of blunt scissors (Rounded tip only. Remove from packaging.)
- Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (No loose-leaf or filler paper.)
- One 30-centimeter, 12" ruler
- One hand-held pencil sharpener (Remove from packaging.)
- One large eraser (No pencil cap erasers.)
- Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers (Remove from packaging and use a rubber band to hold the pencils together.
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- One 12"x14" to 14"x17" finished size cotton or lightweight canvas bag with handles (Solid color or kid-friendly fabric. No logos, reusable shopping bags or backpacks. Download sew pattern at cwskits.org)

All items must be packed inside of the bag. The MyShopAngel website has an affordable CWS Kit bag option for bulk purchase. Visit cwskits.org/bag to order.

Optional: Loose school kit items may be placed in a large ziploc type bag to keep them together. Remove the air, seal the bag and place inside of the cotton/canvas bag.



RMMO Offering

The Retired Ministers & Missionaries Offering (RMMO) is one of the annual mission offerings FBC participates in. We will be receiving this offering during the month of August. Gifts to RMMO help provide retired American Baptist clergy with a year end "Thank You" gift as well as fund an emergency assistance fund for that same cohort. In 2020 3,371 pastors and missionaries received "thank you" gifts from 57% of the offering given.
