The Psalms have trained us, and can continue to train us, to look for the in-breaking of God: those moments when sunshine breaks through the clouds. I know for me, especially as I'm taking a class about what the Church is supposed to be for the world, this is a hopeful time! There's so much we can learn and discover!

And it can be that for you, too. Because we're going to be walking through change, along this open road, together. And I'm excited for that. Nervous? Sure. But excited. Dan has left us in good shape, and I will always be grateful for what he's done to send us off well. But now, it's our turn to lead ourselves well... with God. Mostly God. And He's done this before. He'll do it again. We just need to pray, a lot, and learn to listen, take things one at a time, and wait. Peace.



There will be a gift basket at the Send-Off party for the congregation to add any cards of well wishes or gift cards, particularly from the Sioux Falls area.




