THE SEARCH

When I was at Indiana Wesleyan University I took an astronomy class. I've always felt there's something captivating about the stars, space, and particularly the moon. I actually had a dream about orbiting the moon recently. It was terrifying! But such is often the case with dreams. Even the happy ones seem to have an element of risk in them - something that gets your adrenaline going for whatever reason. It doesn't have to be from conflict either. Just the prospect of something *new* is enough to pique our interest. Do you see where I'm going with this?

Over the last few weeks we've been hearing a lot about what might be *new*. Sure we've been hearing the story of Christmas each week, and that is certainly not a new story for us but we *have* experienced it in a new way this year. Sure, we've done a lot of normal things but the circumstances are still different, and sometimes that's enough to highlight the things that are new. Maybe I'm speaking in circles here, but I want to recognize that, even now, before much in our lives has in actuality changed, we are experiencing the new which is to come.

Maybe that thought is accompanied by a sinking feeling in your stomach. Maybe it's accompanied by a lifting of your spirits. Regardless, I want you to pay attention to that feeling and ask yourself, "Why am I feeling this way?"

We did that a few weeks ago when we hosted our first town hall meeting. Yes, I said "first" because there are sure to be more. And that's a good thing! Because it's January! It's a new year! It's a time to dream! And as you read this, it will also still (technically) be Christmas. So, I want you to think about the Magi for a minute.

When I took that astronomy class, we did a lab where we traced the movement of the stars back to around the time Jesus was born. I don't remember the name of the software we used for this experiment, but we were tracing constellation movements which paralleled the imagery in the book of Isaiah. It was one of the wildest experiments I've done, but what we realized is that the Magi had probably done this exact experiment in real time and saw in the sky that which prophesied the coming Christ. Skeptical? I was, too. But as we saw constellations of dragons and a virgin giving birth emerge in the ancient sky, it became clear that these Magi were dreamers and listeners people who looked to the sky and wondered what God might be telling them.

As Christmas comes to a close, we're invited to do the same kind of dreaming. In the coming days and weeks, we will begin the transition from Research to Search. Or to put it in terms the Magi embodied, we will transition from looking to the sky, to wandering to Bethlehem, and you are critical in that process. You'll hear more about what's to come soon, but, in the meantime, keep sending us what you're dreaming about, even if it's scary. Even if you feel your stomach drop or your adrenaline rush, it might not be because of conflict but because of the prospect of something *new*.

So what is God telling you? What are you seeing? What are you hearing in Scripture, prayer, and the world which is encouraging us to go somewhere we've never been before? I'm looking forward to following that star with you.
