Choir! That means get ready for an announcement about practice! The Easter Cantata is here and I'm very excited to get to work. See you soon!



- Ten standard size Band-Aids

FYI: It was decided to stock *Narcan* at FBC due to the diverse groups that meet at the church. *Narcan* is a nasal spray used for known or suspected opioid overdose. #### **HELP NEEDED**

Mark your calendar for screening to be held on March 20th in Fellowship Hall.

Lifeline Screening has conducted over 10 million screenings since 1993. Screenings available are:

- Carotid Artery Disease (through an ultrasound to check for buildup in the arteries, a leading cause of stroke.)
- Atrial Fibrillation, or AFib (through a 6 lead electrocardiogram to screen for AFid, which can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure.)
- Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (through an ultrasound to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of a life threatening aneurysm.)
- Peripheral Arterial Disease, or PAD (an ankle-Brachial Index test performed using a blood pressure cuff on the arms and legs.) PAD increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.

## Lenten Bible Study

The Eclipse of the Son
The Daily Progression of Darkness during Holy Week

Eclipse - "The total or partial obscuring of one heavenly body by another."

Light and darkness are twin themes throughout all of scripture beginning with the third verse of the first chapter of Genesis. At the very center of Christianity is the key "I am" statement by Jesus, "I am the light of the world." Our theme verse on the cover, "When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land... Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last." Mark 15:33...37.

Jesus died, and the power of light which he created in the beginning, was revealed as a cosmic grief covering the land with darkness. It was a darkness that was a threat throughout his three years of teaching, and the days of Holy Week illustrate the progression of that darkness as it slowly eclipsed his life on the cross.
