SEASON OF THE CHURCH: LENT EBRUARY 22ND - APRIL 8TH

... in Vision and Prayer

The beginning of this year positioned us to see every month as a continuation of our goal to be "God's People Moving Forward Together." Since then, we've emphasized the role love plays in that forward momentum, but this month, March, will be focused on the role of vision and prayer in our forward progress.

Anyone who has spent the last three years listening to me knows how dearly I hold prayer in my life and the life of the church. So, this month has a nice "at-homeness" to it as we embark on some important steps in the transition process.

At the end of February, we introduced the members of our Search Committee. If you missed the service on February 26th, I'd recommend you go back and watch that to see who these representatives are. However, that service is not our only chance to engage with them. Just as we prayed over them during our February Coffee Fellowship, we will be making space for a more intentional "commissioning" as they begin this new leg of the race. So, be on the lookout for information regarding that Commissioning Service. We will have dates and times made available soon (if not already by the time of this publishing).

That service will not be the only means of moving forward in vision and prayer though. Throughout March, we are committing to praying over the many needs, causes, and plans of First Baptist during what we are calling "31 Days of Prayer." Each day during the month of March we hope to have 3-4 people pray over a list that will be compiled for an hour each. Yes, an hour. That may seem like a lot, and I'm not going to lie to you when I say that it is. But, there's a reason for that. Do we think that an hour of prayer is more effective than a simple prayer spoken with great intent? Certainly not. Yet there is something to the habit that is built by such intentional praying as a community. Prayer is not simply something to be done as an individual, nor is it to be done solely seeking answers to questions or provisions for needs. Instead, prayer is something to be entered into which recognizes the work God is already doing. And not only that, it is a conversation to be joined which senses God's love, loss, heartbreak, and joy.

As a community, our identity comes from the fact that we are forever unified to the ongoing conversation that is "Father, Son, and Holy Spirit." In that conversation our vision can be cast outward, toward the world in which we live *with* God. Therefore, as we commission the Search Committee we are also preparing and retraining ourselves to behold the wonders of God's love and mercy which covers the lives of every person we meet.

Uncannily, I just finished a book called *Beholding* by Strahan Coleman. It's a book entirely devoted to seeing our entire lives as extensions of prayer - prayer which joins the conversation God is already having. So as we move forward together in vision and prayer, may we do so by building our lives around the awareness that our vision is prayer and vice versa. Our prayer is not that God would make something come true, but that we would see that which is already true of our lives and the world because God, in Christ, has already made it so. Amen.

Update on Malik Zada family

Several members of the congregation have approached members of the Afghan Family Resettlement Team to ask how our family is doing and we realized that we have not given any updates recently. Some of this has been intentional in order to preserve a level of confidentiality for this family. This was something that was ingrained in us at our earliest training, and is still recommended at this time. We are asked to remember that these families did not arrive here by choice, but it was concerns for their own safety that caused them to leave their home country. Many of the families still have extended family back home, and we would not want to jeopardize their safety either.

We can tell you, our support team has been hard at work helping this family to get established here. The children are enrolled and attend school, the mother attends English classes 1-2 per week, the father has a full time job and is attending Ivy Tech in order to improve his qualifications. They require little assistance from us these days for general day to day living, they have become independent with much of their medical and dental needs, as well as with food, clothing, rent, insurances, cell phones and internet. They are happy in Columbus, and frequently express their gratitude for the help and support of the church and the support team. We have noted that they are able to connect easily with some of the other Afghan families, and have become friends with many of the support team members. They have participated in some "American " traditions including trick or treat, Christmas meals, a visit to Ceraland for the Christmas lights and meals at American homes. The support team have also been invited to their home and we are learning more about their culture as well. This family has been a delight to assist and get to know and they will remain our friends for years to come.

The funds that were raised for this mission have been put to good use, and there is a small amount available for this mission, if and when the need arises. We would like to express our thanks for all the help and support from the church, in assisting with this ministry.
