God's people move forward together. I've been thinking about that a lot recently, especially during a class about Theologies of Exile in the Old Testament. I think we could describe what we're experiencing now as a kind of exile. Not in the sense as my class understood it, but in the sense of the Biblical Story called Exodus. We are on a journey, an exodus if you will, in which we find ourselves caravaning through the wilderness toward a bright future. We know the words God has spoken to us, the promises He's given, and we rely on them to carry us through. However, on this road, we have to take the time and work to remember them.

Remember. The next time you pick up your Bible, take note of how many times that word comes up. Not just as a word itself, but as an action. Maybe the word itself doesn't appear, but, instead, is performed through some rite that embraces the memory of God among his people. This is paramount to the survival and eventual thriving of God's people in the land to which they are called. Unfortunately, once they arrive, they quickly forget those promises or take them for granted.

Throughout Scripture we see this cycle of exile and homecoming play out over and over, not least of which in the narrative of Holy Week as we might consider Jesus' death and resurrection as a kind of exile and homecoming. So this cycle is normal. It's natural. It's a process of death and resurrection, and it's to this cycle that we are called.

Eugene Peterson was once asked to summarize the essence of Christianity, so, despite his attempts to evade the question, he simply said: "Practice Resurrection."

With Holy Week upon us at the beginning of April, I can't think of a better way to remember who we are and what we are called to do. We're called to practice resurrection, to remember the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus and what that means for how we live amongst ourselves, our families, and our neighbors.

As we enter into April, that is simply my prayer for us. That we would practice resurrection so that the Fellowship of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit would color our own interactions, lives, households, and communities.

As a people on our own exodus toward a brighter future, this is key to remembering. So, wherever we set up camp, wherever we sit and worship in the wilderness, wherever the ark of the covenant and tabernacle go, we can be a traveling emissary of love, peace, and fellowship because of our remembrance of the life of Jesus. This is what we do in remembrance of him. And just like every other cycle of homecoming, maybe we'll pick up unexpected others on the way, learning from them how Jesus has sent them on a journey toward a brighter future, into the land of the living to which we are all intended. This is my vision. This is my dream. As you've been praying this month, have you seen the same promised land? If not, might you join me in it?
