I am praying now, and I believe the whole Church will be both blessed and unified as we pray together for the Search Committee and all their members who will help us find the right person for the future of First Baptist Church of Columbus." What a great spirit and testimony.

"Practicing Our Faith." For those of you who have been here longer than I, you'll recognize that phrase. It's one that's hung above the Baptistry many times, on at least three different banners, and has occupied a lot of time in Staff and Church Planning meetings. Maybe that phrase is too familiar. Maybe it's one of those fill-in-the-blank phrases that you can finish when someone simply says "Practicing..." If so, that's ok! But I want to reframe the phrase with one word: Discipleship. That's another word that is probably way too familiar, but as I think about it, I don't know how much we've really focused on it, defined it, and practiced practicing it.

Yes, you read that right: "Practiced practicing." I know what you're thinking: But Daniel we don't practice practicing it, we just practice it. Why spend the time practicing something that is, in and of itself, a practice to simply do?

You're not wrong. But, what if we thought about it a different way? What if, instead of simply saying we need to just "Go be the people of God" we ask ourselves again: "How are we to be the people of God?" "What does it mean to be the people of God?" "What are the things that the people of God are supposed to do?"

Go ahead, sit down and make a list of those things and then come back.....

Ready?

So when I make the list, here's some of the things I come up with: prayer, Bible Study, charity, fellowship, evangelism, hospitality, healing, worship (which includes a whole host of other things), and many other things that I missed. And you're right, these are things to simply "do." But go through that list and ask yourself: "Self, which of these do I do? Which ones don't I do? Which ones do I wish I were better at?"

Better. Now that's an interesting word isn't it? Discipleship is a conversation about human-centered growth. How can we be the hands, feet, and words of Jesus to others better? Those are the things that we practice practicing, and we do that by joining together in worship, study, and fellowship to help each other grow. It's amazing how spiritual disciplines are so closely tied to our personalities and strengths. Inevitably though, there will always be things that we can get better at because we're stronger in some areas more than others. That's not a bad thing it's a beautiful thing! It's part of why we are called to exist in community with each other - so that we can help each other grow and can make up for each other's weaknesses.

This summer is going to be a practice in "practicing practicing." Sometimes that will mean going out and simply doing something. Other times it will mean breaking something down into bite size pieces and getting back to the fundamentals of 1. What 2. Why and 3. How we are to walk with Coach Jesus. That catch you off guard a little bit? Good! The training has begun...

Last call for the collection of Stuffed animals for children who are treated at Columbus and Seymour hospitals is Sunday May 28.


