#### **LIGHT Ladies Bible Study**

The next four session Bible study will focus on the life of Gideon which is found in the book of ludges. The first session will on Thursday October 19th at 9:00 am at the church.

Compared with some of the other judges ruling Israel, Gideon seems to get a lot of press in the Old Testament, covering more than two chapters (compared with some of them only getting part of one chapter).

Known as the Greatest Judge of Israel, readers might be surprised when they dive into the narrative to find a timid ruler. In fact, when we first meet him, he's hiding from the enemies on a threshing floor.

### **Men of Faith Bible Study**

The next Men of Faith Bible study will be from the book of Revelation. The theme for the six-week study is "Back to the Future," and our key scripture text is Revelation 1:8; "The Alpha and Omega the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come."

The study will not be a chapter by chapter verse by verse study. Instead each of the six sessions will be a text that is included in the Lectionary preaching schedule which covers a three year period.

Eugene Peterson makes this excellent comment about the book of Revelation. ""I do not read the Revelation to get additional information about the life of faith in Christ. I Have read it all before in law and prophet, in gospel and epistle. Everything in the Revelation can be found in the previous sixty-five books of the Bible. The Revelation adds nothing of substance to what we already know. The truth of the gospel is already complete, revealed in Jesus Christ. There is nothing new to say on the subject. But there is a new way to say it."

Our new way of saying it is examining the book through the lens of "Back to the Future." The first session will be on Friday, October 27th at 7:00 am at the church. All men are invited. It's a good time to invite a friend.
