Whether it's setting aside a regular time for prayer, fasting, participating in the L.I.G.H.T or Men of Faith Bible studies, or reading through the Gospels on your own, let your practices be genuine and life-giving.

Easter is a reminder of the new life that is possible in Christ—a life that each one of us is called to live out in practical ways every day. As we look towards the resurrection, let's also look for ways to bring hope and renewal to our church and community. How is God calling all of us towards deeper humility, sacrificial love, and new life in Christ?

I look forward to walking these next weeks with you, in prayer and in person, as we anticipate the joy of Easter together.

LENT and HOLY WEEK

March is jam-packed this year! Easter is an odd holiday in that it has the most wiggle room each year. Sometimes it's early. Sometimes it's late. Knowing that Easter is scheduled according to the Lunar Calendar adds some mystery to the whole thing I think. We don't operate that way anymore, and yet, one of the two biggest celebrations of the year for us is scheduled according to a counter-cultural method of timekeeping. If that's not food for thought, I don't know what is.

Lent is early this year. We're already in it! Next year, that won't be the case. The whole season will be month a later than it is right now, but there's good to be found in either case. This year, we started Lent with an Ash Wednesday service on February 14th. Nothing like celebrating love by remembering that "from dust you were made and to dust you shall return." That said, because Lent is so early, that dust imagery is very potent.

In these "blah" days of February and March, there's a lot of dead foliage around us. That's particularly noticeable when we have snow. The darkness of the dust is accentuated and the snow has its own "ashy" quality to it. Personally, I love the snow. I think it's both beautiful and shows how the world needs these different seasons in order for it to thrive. The same can be said of us.

During this season of Lent, remembering our mortality is not something to fear or grieve, but something to steward, prune, and nurture. Our bodies are fallow fields for resurrection, and nature is constantly reminding us of that. But resurrection can't come without death. This is why Lent is beautiful. We get the peaks and the valleys of life all in a 40 day journey. In this season, we get to embrace the complexity of human emotions. If you joined us for the Movie Night, you'll remember how Pete Docter's philosophy in making "Up" was to pair every tear with a laugh. If that's not the journey of Easter, I don't know what is.

As we continue this journey together I want to draw your attention to a few opportunities to embrace this season. First, in the gathering place is a form on which you can commit to remembering a loved one on Easter Sunday. If you would like to donate \$10 dollars in someone's name for an Easter Lily which you can take home after the service, you can send the funds to the office or designate it in the offering plate. Second, our Maundy Thursday service is the beginning of our Holy Week activities. We'll be hosting a choral-led service on Thursday, March 28th at 7:00 in the Sanctuary. Good Friday continues our observance of Holy Week as Love Chapel is hosting a service in the Commons at 12:00 Noon on March 29th. Finally, Easter Sunday arrives with a full day! Sunrise service is at 7:30 in the Chapel, followed by Breakfast, and capped with the "big" service in the Sanctuary at 9:30.

The choir is putting in great work preparing for our Maundy Thursday service, but come anticipating just part of the story. It's easy to go to one thing hoping to hear the full story. But I encourage you to take full advantage of Lent this year and experience the slow passing of each day as we get closer to the cross. Remember: it's almost Friday. But Sundays's coming.

The Fish Offering for the Love Chapel food pantry was \$5,756, over \$1,300 more than last year. A big THANK YOU to all who contributed. This allowed the purchase of canned peach slices, spaghetti in tomato and meant sauce, canned beans, pasta sauce, toaster tarts, crispy oat cereal and mac and cheese. The totals: 370 cases of 5,820 items weighing 4,565 pounds! The food reached the pantry on the morning of Feb. 12. Some members met to offer thanks to God and to bless the food and those who will benefit from it. The Love Chapel staff expressed gratitude for our generous support.

Also, thanks to all who brought items for Soozi Ford's Ukraine mission trip with Kristy Engel and other International Ministries' personnel. Included were 19 bottles of vitamins for adults/children, 13 tubes of pain creams, one ibuprofen and several empty pill containers.

One 1-gallon Ziploc bag
One hand towel (15"X28" to 16"X32")
One washcloth
One wide-tooth comb (at least 6 inches)
removed from the package
One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from pkg.

One bath-sized bar of soap in the original pkg. One toothbrush in original pkg. Ten standard size Band-Aids Through White Cross, these special recovery kits provide both tangible assistance to people in need and show that SOMEONE truly cares. These are sent to Church World Service, which sees that they are sent to those in need.

All items must BE NEW and fit in the Ziploc bag. A donation of \$2 per kit for the processing fee is appreciated. Drop off near the kitchen area by *March 17th*. Please contact Judy Alexander with any questions.
